**Jail Operations Millage Question**

For the purpose of funding ongoing operating expenses of the Jackson County Jail, shall the Constitutional limitation upon the total amount of taxes which may be assessed in one (1) year upon all property within the County of Jackson, Michigan be increased by up to 0.25 mills (\$0.25 per thousand dollars of state taxable valuation), for a period of ten (10) years (2024-2033) inclusive? If approved and levied in full, this millage will raise an estimated \$1,516,970 in the first calendar year of the levy.

**Community College**

**Millage Proposal**

This proposal will allow the college to restore its originally authorized charter millage rate of 1.33 mills on all property, with the revenue of this proposal to be used for enhancing job training, job placement and professional trades education programs.

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes originally established by election in 1964 which may be assessed against all property within the community college district boundaries of Jackson College, Michigan, be increased by 0.1973 mill (\$0.1973 per \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 10 years, from 2025 to 2034, inclusive, to provide funds for enhancing job training, job placement, and professional trades education programs; if this millage is approved and levied in full in 2025, it is estimated to raise approximately \$1,200,000 (this millage is to restore millage lost as a result of the reductions required by the Michigan Constitution of 1963)?

**Jackson District Library  
Millage Renewal Proposal**

Shall the Jackson District Library, County of Jackson, be authorized to levy a millage annually in an amount not to exceed 1.7411 mills (\$1.7411 per \$1,000 of taxable value), which is a renewal of the millage rate that expires in 2024, against all taxable property within the Jackson District Library district for a period of eight (8) years, 2025 to 2032, inclusive, for the purpose of providing funds for all district library purposes authorized by law? The estimate of the revenue the Jackson District Library will collect in the first year of levy (2025) if the millage is approved and levied by the District Library is approximately \$10,750,000. A portion of the revenue collected may be subject to capture by the Brownfield Redevelopment Authorities of the City of Jackson, Blackman Charter Township, Leoni Township, Columbia Township, and Summit Township.
